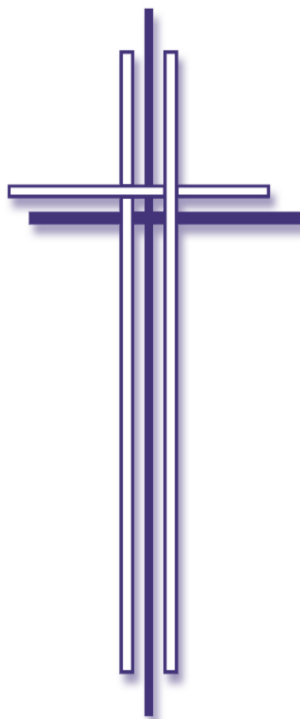

Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must attend a Baptismal Instruction Class offered at 7:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of each month.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

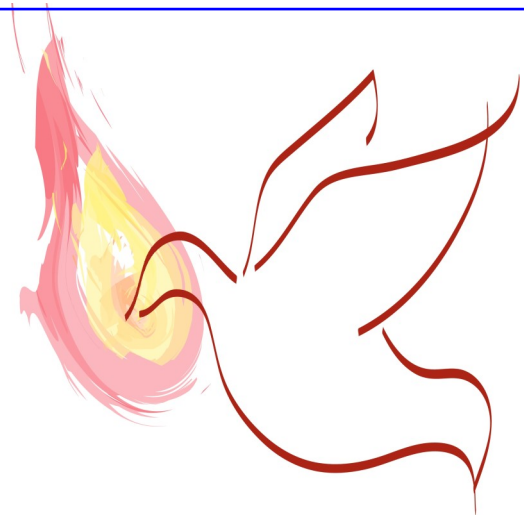

Sunday Reflection

From the day of the Ascension until Pentecost came, the Apostles and followers of Jesus were gathered together in secrecy, praying unceasingly, yet filled with fear. They remained hidden until the Lord sent His promised gift of the Holy Spirit, manifested in flame, wind, and renewed courage. The Apostles went out fearlessly, proclaiming the truth of the Gospel to the world.

In John's Gospel, Jesus Himself appears to the Apostles, breathing forth the gift of the Holy Spirit and sending them out to bring His merciful gift of forgiveness and peace to the world. This commissioning gives the Apostles the courage to go out, despite the very real threat of persecution, to share the Gospel with all nations.

In our times, we are experiencing something similar to what the Apostles endured before the coming of the Holy Spirit. Our current enemy is an invisible virus, which has caused us to be hidden, isolated, and often fearful. We pray behind locked doors. We may fear sickness and death, the horrible toll of the virus. We may fear persecution by government authorities if we reopen our businesses, churches, and society. We may fear financial ruin. We may fear the condemnation of our families and friends if we disagree about these issues. All these fears are valid and should not be lightly dismissed. But neither should we allow our fears to win out over our faith.

Jesus warns us that suffering and persecutions will come, but with Him, we will overcome evil. He knows our fears but reassures us, over and over again, "Be not afraid." Jesus does not say this lightly or casually, because He knows only too well the horror of suffering. The Risen Lord still bears the wounds of His own passion and death. He does not ask us to suffer alone, but invites us to unite with Him in any suffering we have to face, and He will give us strength and courage.

Cling to Jesus, no matter what fears you may be facing. Know that He is with you always. He is nearer to you than your own heart. Trust in Him, lean on Him, conquer with Him. And follow Him on the Way of the Cross, asking for the courage of the Holy Spirit to fill you with fire every day of your life.

Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa
{2 of 12}



Sister Angeline returned to the USA but this time to Pittsburgh in May, 1925 as Assistant Superior; and then was reassigned as Mother Superior of Our Lady's Home in the Bronx in September 1926. At the age of 33 she was now in charge of 18 Little Sisters and 230 elderly residents.

She prayed her heart out in the chapel that she might indeed be "the Good Mother" and also "the good Servant" whom the Lord had placed over His household to give them food at the opportune time; food for their tables, and also for their souls.

She was aware of loneliness as a great Cross to the elderly who were institutionalized. She empathized with the needs of individuals who for the first time in their lives must adjust to corporate dwelling and institutional behavior. Her goal was 'resident-centered care'. It was her belief that residents would be treated as Christ himself, with ultimate respect and dignity.

She understood the differences in the expectations of the elderly of Europe and those of the United States and she made changes to her facility to accommodate these differences. Therefore she introduced small adaptations in the diet plan, and niceties like new paint, religious colored prints and statues, and simple new furniture.

2020 Census: If your household has not yet completed the 2020 census, go to <https://my2020census.gov> and use your census ID number that arrived in the mail from the U.S. Census Bureau to get counted.

- It's quick and easy. The 2020 Census questionnaire will take about 10 minutes to complete.
- It's safe, secure, and confidential. Your information and privacy are protected.
- Your response helps to direct billions of dollars in federal funds to local communities for schools, roads, and other public services.
- Results from the 2020 Census will be used to determine the number of seats each state has in Congress and your political representation at all levels of government.

Make sure that everyone who was in your household on April 1 is counted. That includes babies, children and elderly relatives.
