Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Sunday Reflection

In the End, Does it Matter?

When I was a teenager, the priest I would go to for confession used to tell me, over and over: "In the end, we all get the same dirty hole in the ground."

What he meant was, it doesn't matter how rich or smart or well-liked we are. We're all heading to the same place. This life comes to an end for every man. All the money he earns, all the stuff, all the worldly esteem, will at some point be of no further use. We all get the same dirty hole in the ground.

It was an important message for me to hear, because at the time, it all seemed so important: my after-school job and my FAFSA application and my grades. The admiration of my friends and teachers. I was so consumed with what I was going to become that I wasn't spending a lot of time thinking about who I was going to become. But the who is the only thing that lasts until the next life.

And to be honest, it's all still too important to me. Avoiding sadness and disappointment. Saving money and being liked. Focusing on "the five-year plan" when it comes to career, house plans, and a whole bunch of other things I can't take to my dirty hole in the ground.

Jesus was radical in his teaching that the "stuff" in life wasn't all that important. It was radical for him to say that the worldly signs of success — wealth, popularity, pleasure — did not amount to a whole lot in the grand scheme of things and that suffering could sanctify us. It was radical in the ancient world, and it's radical today.

Are we ready to be radical, too?

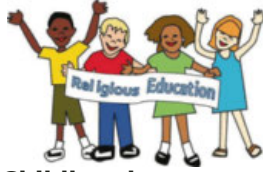

Carmelite Corner

Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa (4 of 12)

On the arrival of Mother Angeline and her six companions to St. Elizabeth's old Rectory, in September 1929, they were greeted by the local priests with items to help set up their chapel. One month after this the stock market crashed and the Great Depression began. Overnight, wealthy people became paupers. It is a phenomenon both in the natural and supernatural order that at this precise point in history Mother M. Angeline Teresa and her six companions began their new venture. There was a greater need for the aged and God helped them provide it during these difficult financial times.

By August 1931 they were able to purchase an acre of land in the Bronx along Van Cortlandt Park South which included the RCA Tower building, which was three stories and was already divided into single rooms. It was named, "St. Patrick's Home." The facility continued to grow with eight major expansions through 1989.

Fifty nine foundations were developed during Mother Angeline's life time (1893-1984), including St. Luke's Infirmary, Centralia, WA 1943 to 1945. Currently there are 18 residences in the eastern United States, including their original St. Patrick's Home, and one in Ireland.

A Note from the Serra Club

"Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is in the Lord." (from Jeremiah 17: 5-8)

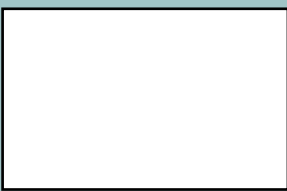
