Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Wednesday of the month in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Spiritual Practices

Ignatian Spirituality

In a conversation with members of the Jesuit order, Pope Francis said the life situations of everyday Catholics aren't black and white, but rather vary on a spectrum of gray. Because people's lives are complex, the Pope stressed the need for the Church to teach seminarians more about spiritual discernment. He cautioned that many priests can't relate to or accompany the people they counsel, since they haven't been properly formed. We as lay people also need to be formed in Godly decision making, so that we can learn to make decisions based on where God calls us. Fortunately for us, God, through St. Ignatius, has given us the Spiritual Exercises to teach us discernment.

Benedictine Spirituality:

In the Office of Readings for the Ascension, we find a portion of a homily by St. Augustine. He writes: 'Why do we on earth not strive to find rest with him in heaven even now, through the faith, hope, and love that unite us to him? While in heaven he is also with us; and we while on earth are with him... We cannot be in heaven, as he is on earth, by divinity, but in him we can be there by love.'

Our small group meets on the third Thursday of the month, this time May 16, at noon in the parish library. We begin and end with prayer, and read, reflect on, and discuss a portion of the Rule of St. Benedict and commentary. Our meetings last about an hour. You're welcome to join us!

Day X of Retreat: Final Meditation

At the offertory, when the matter of sacrifice is on the paten and in the chalice, let us offer ourselves to God as well, so that he who transforms and changes the bread and wine into the flesh and blood of Jesus, also change us to the degree that we may say with St. Paul, "I live, no, not I, but Christ lives in me" (Gal 2:20).

During Mass, we call down the blessing of God on our offerings. With Mary let us press close to Jesus and drink the pure blood from his side, which will transform us into new men and women.

Holy Communion is the seal on our vows (our Baptism). "The Body of Our Lord Jesus Christ keep your soul for eternal life. Amen"

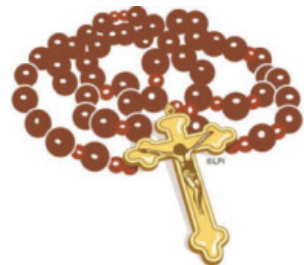

Sunday Reflection

The Truth We Cannot See

I only pray out loud when I want my kids to hear what I'm saying.

I know what you're thinking — *hypocrites in the synagogue and the street corner; go to your room and shut the door* — but I think if Jesus had to raise children he would understand where I'm coming from. I pray out loud not because I want my kids to think I'm holy and not because I want them to admire me but because I want them to know how broken I am, how desperately I rely on the mercy and love of God.

It's also a really effective way to send a message. "God, I'm sorry I've been losing my patience today. Please help me. And send your Holy Spirit to make these kids stop fighting."

Vocal prayer, in front of other people, is an incredibly vulnerable action, so it strikes me whenever Jesus chooses to pray out loud in front of his disciples. Surely, mental prayer was something of a perpetual state for him. I imagine Jesus was ceaselessly in conversation with his Father in heaven throughout even the most ordinary of days. So, when he chooses to make those communications public, my ears perk up.

He wants his kids to hear what he's saying.

In John, chapter 17, we see that he wants us to remember who we are. His disciples are about to see things that will shake the very foundations of their faith. The only way they will make it to the other side is if they remember that truth does not consist only of what we can see with our eyes.

This is the same truth in which we have been consecrated. We belong to this truth in a way the world will never understand or accept. It is the truth we cannot see.

"I gave them your word, and the world hated them, because they do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world." John 17:14

Note: this reflection is based on the readings for the 7th Sunday in Easter (for those dioceses who celebrate the Ascension on Thursday.)
