Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Wednesday of the month in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

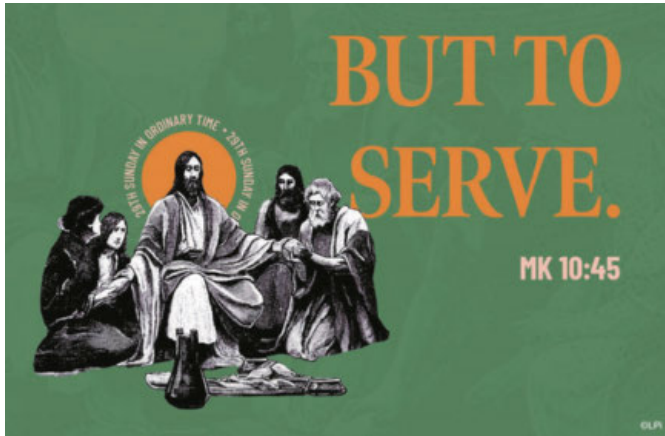

Sunday Reflection

Made to Serve

I thought it often in my first year as a mother, when I was every day discovering what this new life of parenthood looked and felt like: doing anything with kids is a hundred times harder than doing it without kids. But it's a thousand times better.

From eating dinner to going to Mass to taking a walk around the block — every single outing, even the simplest ones, had an extra level of logistical complexity. I had to bring diapers and food and extra clothes, I had to be ready to distract, to comfort, to settle, to de-escalate. Before, I just showed up, did the thing and went home. Now, I had to be ready to coordinate.

I had to be ready to serve.

But even while everything had become so much more complicated, so much harder, there was suddenly a joyfulness to these experiences that had not been there before. Yes, I was a mom now, a servant if there ever was one, constantly tending to someone else's needs, and it was difficult. Sometimes terribly so. But it was beautiful (not in a physical way — I was usually covered in baby spit-up — but my soul had that glow, you know?).

It was the first time in my life that I really understood what it was to serve, and the power of that vocation to which we are all called.

This isn't just true of parenthood. It's true of every relationship. When we find someone we can meaningfully, wholeheartedly serve — our spouse, our best friend, our employees, our students, our patients, whoever it is — the effort becomes nothing compared to the joy and the fulfillment we find in the work.

We were made for greatness, and Christ tells us that to be great is to serve. So don't be afraid of greatness. Don't be afraid to serve.

A Richland family of five found themselves homeless last winter due to a lapse in employment. The neighbor's self-help attitude secured them recent housing and childcare assistance, thereby allowing for a return to a safe living arrangement for their family and a resumption of a productive employment search. SVdP assisted this family with a past-due utility bill during the summer heat wave, avoiding the disruption and discomfort of a service interruption. The neighbors were extremely appreciative of our participation in their ongoing efforts to keep their family safe, comfortable and together.

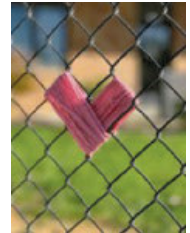

Benedictine Spirituality:

Benedictines read a portion of the Holy Rule daily, three times during a year. These days, we're reading chapters in the Rule about praying the Divine Office (also known to us as the Liturgy of the Hours). St. Benedict explains in great detail how and when the Psalms and other components that make up the office are to be said. Why the Psalms? They are from the Hebrew tradition of prayer, and one that Jesus followed.

The Liturgy can be challenging at first. What hour is it? What day/memorial/feast/solemnity is it? (I found it rather like learning to ride a bicycle; at first I was all wobbly and uncoordinated and unsure, but then I found my balance and began to roll along.)

St. Benedict was writing his instructions in the 6th century. Since then, our current Liturgy of the Hours has added an Office of Readings, collected over the centuries to instruct and enlighten us. It truly is a marvelous benefit to our prayer life.

Carmelite Corner

Living in God's Presence (7 of 10)

Excerpts from Chapter 9, *Living in God's Presence, Climbing The Mountain, The Carmelite Journey*, edited by Johan Bergstrom-Allen, TOC, St. Albert's Press & Edizioni Carmelitane, 2010

Feeling a lack of God's presence; the Dark Night:

The Carmelite tradition teaches us that there are times when—even if we are praying—we do not perceive the presence of God. This is often called 'The Dark Night'. It is a natural (even inevitable) part of the spiritual journey. During the 'Dark Night' we feel that God has withdrawn his presence from us... This is not the case, and it is important not to judge our prayer-life on how it makes us feel. What is actually happening in this time is that God is transforming us at a level beyond our senses and feelings so that we can live in his presence in a new and deeper way. In the 'Dark Night' God strips us (temporarily or permanently) of all the pleasures we derive from the 'attachments' and 'securities' that we cling to in place of him—such as rituals and feelings in prayer—and makes us rely entirely on him.

The Dark Night 'declutters' our faith. The temptation is either to give up on prayer, or to redouble our efforts; neither response will help. All we can do is to trust, continue our journey of faith allowing God to work within us, and know that God is present and loving us regardless of whether we feel it or not.
