

#### **All Our Strength**

I didn't realize how much my arms would hurt when I became a mom.

It occurred to me first during Mass when my daughter was just a few weeks old. She was the kind of kid who could only sleep in someone's arms. I desperately wanted her to stay quiet during the service, so I held the swaddled bundle in front of me like it was a bomb, not daring to move. By the homily, my arms were on fire.

I quickly realized this was a common scenario of my new life as a parent. Holding, rocking, bouncing, restraining, dragging — honestly, my weak little chickenarms had never been worked out like this before. It took all my strength.

But isn't that the way it is with everything that's worthwhile? It takes all your strength. Not some of it. Not most of it. All of it.

I am a fairly active Catholic. My faith impacts a lot of areas of my life. But there are still boundaries that I've drawn around God. There are places I haven't let Him in. Things I keep "for myself." Experiences that are just so full of me, so full of my own plans and my own desires.

But God desires everything. Not because He is selfish, but because He is good, and wise. Because He knows that the places we keep from Him will become filled with something else. He wants to get there first. He wants to lay His claim.

He wants all our strength. All our heart. All our soul. All our mind. Not most of it. All of it.

Can we give it to Him?

St. Benedict quotes today's Gospel in the first lines of Chapter 4 (The Tools for Good Works) in his Rule. To love God, to love our neighbors, and to love ourselves is the very essence of spiritual health and the foundation for all other 'good' actions.

Michael Casey, OSCO, writes in *Seventy-Four Tools for Good Living: Reflections on the Fourth Chapter of Benedict's Rule,* that "the condition for giving our love to another is our first receiving love from someone. In the same way, we love God because we have experienced that God first loved us. The more we have experienced God's love, the more likely we are to return God's love."

The scribe in today's Gospel must have realized the depth of God's love for him, when he proclaims that the love of God, neighbor, and self is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices. How about us? Have we found the same awareness?

#### Living in God's Presence (9 of 10)

Excerpts from Chapter 9, *Living in God's Presence, Climbing The Mountain, The Carmelite Journey*, edited by Johan Bergstrom-Allen, TOC, St. Albert's Press & Edizioni Carmelitane, 2010

The simplicity of prayer for Saint Thérèse (The Little Flower):

St. Thérèse of Lisieux (d. 1897) wrote: 'For me, prayer is an aspiration of the heart, it is a simple glance directed to heaven, it is a cry of gratitude and love in the midst of trial as well as joy, which expands my soul and unites me to Jesus.' This prayer of aspiration has long been favored by Carmelites as a way to take up Saint Paul's injunction to 'Pray without ceasing' (1 Thessalonians 5:17) and continually acknowledge God's presence in our hearts. It is a way of keeping vigil with God, of 'keeping watch in prayer' as Saint Albert stated in Chapter 10 of (the Carmelite) Rule.

The word aspiration means 'the action of breathing' as well as 'the action of desiring'. The prayer of aspiration reflects both these meanings: with every breath we take we are in the presence of God who breathed life into the world, the God whom we desire. Lawrence and Thérèse encourage us to pray as we can, pray as we are, and pray where we are. We have feelings and emotions and we tend to rely on these as guides to how 'successful' our prayer is, but (they) knew that is was God who was working in them when they prayed, whether they felt it or not.
