Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 2 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Bride's Room).

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa (6 of 12)

Accolades were heaped on Mother Angeline during her long life: Presidents of the United States, politicians, gerontologists and geriatricians, physicians, churchmen all voiced their amazement at the achievements of one woman ...

She shared the reasons for this success story with her Sisters: "Our apostolate is not only to staff and operate up-to-date homes for the aged. As religious, it is to bring Christ to every old person under our care. Bringing Christ means giving them his compassion, his interest, his loving care, his warmth - morning, noon, and night. It means inspiring the lay people who work with us to give the same type of loving care."

"Loving care means planning little parties and surprises to break the monotony, being concerned when an old person is sick and confused. It means bidding an old person the time of day, and saying a few kind words to them when we meet them.

"In short, doing all those thoughtful things you would want someone to do for your own mother or father."

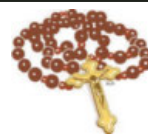

Immigration and Legislative Issues

Amid the heated debates, vitriolic rhetoric, and conflicting perspectives, how should we understand the migration issue? As Catholics, we are called to see beyond the biased news stories and instead give witness to the inherent, God given value of every human being.

We invite you to learn more about Catholic teaching and migration. A few minutes could open your hearts to a new perspective - one rooted in faith, justice, and compassion. Please forward this postcard to family and friends so that they can learn more on this issue as well.



Immigration policy - and the current deportations - are issues of grave concern. You will find links to a letter from Pope Francis (also enclosed in this printed bulletins), Catholic teaching from the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, and a homily by Bishop Tyson addressing the immigration issue on our parish website: www.ckparish.org.

Also on our website are links to another issue of concern to Washington State Catholics: a bill currently under consideration in the state legislature which could remove clergy/penitent privilege, meaning that the law would require priests to divulge to authorities any information about sexual abuse of a minor revealed in the confessional. Certainly such information is reported under any other circumstances—and we screen and train all staff and volunteers working with children and vulnerable adults to prevent abuse from occurring—but we want to keep confession sacred.
