Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 4 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Bride's Room). Registration for the class is required.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting information about matrimony must contact and meet with one of the priests or deacons at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date and should expect to participate in a marriage preparation program.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the RCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1154 for information.

Spiritual Practices

Ignatian Spirituality:

For the past 38 years, the Spiritual Exercises in Everyday Life, here in the Tri-Cities, has been providing a retreat that gives a person a deep encounter with God while teaching various methods of prayer: contemplation, consideration, meditation, colloquy, the Examen, discernment, and more. This flexible retreat is not a class, a lesson, or head knowledge. Instead, SEEL provides a deep dive into spirituality by experiencing it through prayer. It fosters a deeper connection to God by helping you practice various forms of prayer and repetition including consideration, imagination, scriptural contemplation, and meditation.

SEEL is flexible; each person carves out time for prayer and meets with an assigned spiritual director based on his or her own schedule. This is a Catholic, Christian program, and people of all faiths are welcome. Pray about whether you are called to participate this coming session, starting in September.

Carmelite Corner

Excerpts from *Nine Themes in Carmelite Spirituality*, Fr. Patrick McMahon, O. Carm., www.ocarm.org

Carmel has unique gifts for the Church, gifts that are defined by eight centuries of tradition. Carmel's initial document, that is our charter from the Church and which defines who we are, is a document called The Rule of St. Albert. It was given to the Latin Hermits on Mount Cannel by Saint Albert of Vercelli, Patriarch of Jerusalem, eight centuries ago.

The works of St. Teresa and St. John of the Cross, of St. Therese and St. Elizabeth of the Trinity, and so many others have clarified what is particular to our Carmelite Tradition.

There is a need to clarify Carmelite life and spirituality and I ... propose from our heritage nine characteristics that define us. Carmelite tradition is: Christocentric; : Eucharistic; : Scriptural; in harmony with the teaching office of the Pope and Bishops; theologically in the classic Catholic tradition; Marian, Elujan; communitarian, not individualistic; and ninth: has its roots in the Laity.
