

Welcome! If you are new in the parish, please introduce yourself after Mass and arrange to register with us; online at www.ckparish.org or in the office during business hours. We're glad you're here!

Sacrament of Baptism: is scheduled by appointment only; parents must have been registered members of the parish for at least 4 months and must participate in Baptismal Instruction (offered on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Bride's Room). Registration for the class is required.

Sacrament of the Sick: In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, Anointing and Eucharist may be arranged. Call the parish office during office hours, or the emergency number after hours. Contact the Visitation Ministry Office to arrange for home visits.

Celebration of Christian Funeral: After the death of a loved one, you may contact the Parish Office at your earliest convenience to arrange for a date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples requesting that their wedding take place at Christ the King must fill out an application (available on our website or in the parish office). The application must be submitted at least 4 months before the proposed wedding date to allow time for marriage preparation. The form includes information about fees.

Christian Initiation of Adults: Adults requesting information about full initiation into the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) may contact the OCIA Coordinator at 371-0994.

Christian Initiation of Children (CIC): We offer a program for older children who have not been baptized or received their First Communion. Call the Religious Education Office at 946-1675 for information.

Many young families in our community struggle financially, and one big expense is diapers. Disposable diapers cost nearly \$1,000 per year per baby! Cloth diapers are not an option for most struggling families due to day care requirements and a lack of laundry facilities in the home.

Our parish PREPARES ministry is holding a **diaper drive from October 11 to November 2.** The second graders at Christ the King School are also having a diaper drive for PREPARES, so together we can help a lot of families! The parish diaper drive will focus on diaper sizes newborn through 4, as well as baby wipes.

Today's responsorial psalm, verses from Psalm 95, is very familiar to Benedictines and all who pray the Liturgy of the Hours. It is recited every day as the 'invitatory,' the very first prayer of the day. St. Benedict instructs his monks to begin the Office of Vigils with this psalm. The Roman Liturgy of the Hours says this about it: 'This psalm invites the faithful each day to sing God's praise and to listen to his voice and draws them to hope for 'the Lord's rest'.

The invitatory truly helps us begin the day with gratitude, praise, and joy; with acknowledgment that God is in control; and with a reminder that trust and obedience to God's will are required of us.

Excerpts from Nine Themes in Carmelite Spirituality, Fr. Patrick McMahon, O. Carm., www.ocarm.org

Some final thoughts

Carmel is not "make it up as you go along." Carmel is a well defined, spiritual tradition in the Church and we must work to keep it pure and authentic.

We come to Carmel to be shaped by it, not to shape it into something of our own liking. Carmel has proved itself to be of great value to the Church through these eight centuries. We have provided three doctors of the Church: Teresa, John of the Cross, and now, Thérèse of the Child Jesus. We have provided countless saints and blesseds. Pope John Paul has canonized and beatified many saints from our family, Blessed Titus Brandsma, Saint Edith Stein, Raphael Kalinowski, Teresa of the Andes, Elizabeth of the Trinity, the Martyrs of Compiegne....

The Carmelite path is tried and true. If Carmel is giving you the call, come and follow Jesus Christ with us. Turn to Teresa and John, Thérèse and Edith and Titus to learn what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. You don't need to be a priest or a friar or a nun. You don't need to wear a habit or a veil. You don't need to live in a monastery. You don't need anything but to follow Jesus Christ like those first hermits on Mt. Carmel eight centuries ago, like the great saints of the order, like the thousands of men and women around the world today who live a life of allegiance to Jesus Christ.




